Indicators	What to Look For
Forms a research question, searches for information, critically appraises research.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Generates questions that are relevant to the care of patients • Searches health databases such as AMED, MEDLINE and CINHAL • Finds appropriate practice guidelines • Considers the following questions when appraising the literature: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - What are the results of the study? - Are the results valid? - How can I apply the results to my practice or the goals of the team? • Considers the level of evidence in decision-making
Communicates/discusses findings with members of the interprofessional team in order to agree on a plan of care.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provides evidence-based rationale for care provided • Communicates findings to other team members and listens to the perspectives of others • Listens to team members in a positive and respectful manner • Blends the evidence with the clinical state, patient preferences, clinical expertise from various disciplines and available resources • Demonstrates an understanding of their role and the roles of others • Advocates solutions for problems that will benefit all team members • Works towards consensus
